Reshaping your councils - have your say before 25 October

We have been asked to give the following information to parents:


Dorset's councils are considering reducing the number of councils in the county from nine to two from 2019 in order to protect services and reduce costs as their funding continues to decline. It's really important that local people of all ages make their views on the proposals known - councils play a central role in our everyday lives. We all use council services, which range from housing, planning, social care and protecting vulnerable people, through to emptying the bins, maintaining roads and running libraries.

The public consultation is your chance to let them know your views on how these and many other services are delivered in the future. The councils are working together to listen to what residents, businesses and others think about the proposals - they want to hear your views before any decisions are made. Councillors will make their decision in January 2017. The public consultation on the proposals for change runs until 25 October 2016. You can fill out the consultation questionnaire online now.
