Class Dojo

In our school, we expect very good behaviour from all our pupils and we use different strategies for this. From now on, we are making some changes to how we thank the children for their good behaviour and being a good citizen in our school. We will continue to use the Kindness Tree, Marble Time and Red and Yellow Cards but no longer have Raffle tickets and Raffle prizes.



Last week, we introduced to the children 'Class

Dojo' This is a new strategy that links to certain


positive characteristics (behaviour and skills) such as compassion, perseverance, ready to learn, teamwork, to name just a few. Children will be awarded one point for each characteristic. However, children can also lose points!

As the children earn points, they can then choose to spend their points on prizes.

Points can be spent when children have 50, 100, 250 or 500 points on a variety of things.

These include: sit in the teachers chair for the day, wear slippers for the day, choose a raffle prize, show and tell my pet (as long as my parent agrees) and have a lunch party with two friends. For 500 points children will be able to give their whole class a special event!!

The reaction from the children so far has been very enthusiastic, particularly about the rewards that they can obtain! If any parents have any further questions, please speak to the class teachers.



World Book Day and 'Stories at 6'
