Ask the Governors

We have below another couple of questions and answers from a few of our Governors.

Why are Governors important? *(this was a question from George)*

Keith Campbell: They help the teachers and staff, who work very hard and need support. Teaching children is a complex business and (George) the more heads thinking about it the better.
