### <u>Dorset County Hospital Cancer Appeal – 5p Challenge</u>

We are joining in with the 5p appeal launched by Dorchester Hospital earlier this year. The 5p challenge is part of the hospital charity's cancer appeal. They hope to raise £1.75million to support new radiotherapy services being provided at the hospital for the first time. The total they have raised so far is currently standing at just over £960,000.
