Current COVID - 19 Advice

Please find below advice from Public Health Dorset.

COVID-19 is still circulating in our communities, so there are things we can all do to reduce the spread of the virus and other respiratory infections. This includes keeping children off school when they are unwell.

If a child is unwell with symptoms of a respiratory virus, they should:

- Stay at home and avoid contact with others where possible
- Return to school and normal activities when they no longer have a temperature and feel well enough to attend

If a child has a positive COVID-19 test, they should:

- Stay at home and avoid contact with others for 3 days after they took the test
- Return to school and normal activities after 3 days if they no longer have a temperature and feel well enough to do so
