Menus for the new academic year have today been sent home. Orders for September will be able to placed later this week. If anyone has any queries or concerns, please speak to the staff in the office.


Mango in Lunch Boxes

Last but not least...a huge thank you to you all!

You've helped us to raise over £5600 so far this year for the school and your children. That doesn't include the money we'll receive from both Tesco and Waitrose over the summer break plus profits from the school play refreshments and raffle ticket sales. Thank you to everyone who has helped us this year by baking, donating, gardening, volunteering, sponsoring and generally supporting our events.

You'll remember that this year, in addition to the regular activities that we financially support such as the two special weeks, Christmas parties, class dojo prizes and so on, we also donated £1000 towards the new play trail and proudly delivered on the Courtyard garden which we are very pleased to see being put to good use.

Looking ahead, in partnership with the school we are currently researching into: a 'community accessible' defibrillator; an area of astro-turf or 'all weather sports surface' to enable the children to play outside sports when the field is wet and muddy; and the construction of a large sandpit for both playtime and long-jump practice. We are very keen to cover the cost of the first two projects using the funds we have raised throughout this year and finance the sand pit using next year's profits. We've already booked in a Magic Show after school on Thursday 17 October and a school disco on Friday 8 November plus there are lots of other fund-raising ideas currently up our sleeves. So watch this space...
