Planned Industrial Action

You will likely be aware that members of the Education union (the NEU) have voted in favour of strike action. Action is planned to take place on the following days which *may* affect the school:

- **1 February**
- **14 February**
- **28 February**
- **15 and 16 March**

This is the result of a national pay dispute between Education Unions and the Government – it is not due to any actions taken by the school, and it is a matter for the Unions and the Government to resolve independently of the school.

We are writing to ensure you have sufficient notice of what this may mean for your child's attendance on those dates. **The school may be partially open or may be completely open.** The school will undertake a health and safety risk assessment to determine if we need to partially close on these dates. Should the school need to restrict attendance, attendance will be prioritised for:

- *vulnerable pupils*
- *the children of critical workers*

We would also provide work to be completed at home where possible.

While we are doing all that we can to minimise disruption, we advise you to begin considering alternative childcare arrangements, where needed, for these dates.

We apologise for the inconvenience this may mean to you and your child's education, and we hope the dispute can be resolved as soon as possible.

The school is maintaining dialogue with union representatives to understand the exact impact the strikes will have (*if any*) and **we will keep you up-to-date with any arrangements as soon as we can.**
