Evaluation (September 2015)

Objective: To improve assessment opportunities in PE lessons

Objective partially achieved. The PE co-ordinator arranged a meeting with the DASP sports leader in May to discuss different ways of assessing sport under the new National Curriculum. Apart from the middle school, other schools did not assess in PE at present. A staff meeting was held in the summer term with a range of different assessment options discussed. The staff decided to go forward with the assessment grid used in other non-core subjects. The PE co-ordinator thought it would be best if the assessment grids were done by one person to ensure progression in skills throughout the year groups. The PE co-ordinator will continue this objective next year.

Objective: To improve skills to teach and subject knowledge of invasion games

Objective achieved. The DASP sports leader worked with each year group on football skills and rules of a match, as well as teaching sessions that the teacher identified as needing more support with. A rugby coach came to teach a series of lessons throughout the school with teacher's observing and taking notes. A football coach continues to teach once a week across the whole school too. Staff feel they have more ideas in order to teach invasion games.

Objective: To achieve Sainsbury's School Games Kitemark (Bronze)

Objective exceeded. The school achieved a Silver Sainsbury's School Games Kitemark in July! This kitemark rewards schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school. Ofsted use the Mark award as part of their inspection framework and schools can use it as a development tool to aid the PE teacher or Headteacher. Some of the criteria include:- all children participating in 2 hours of PE in the curriculum; providing opportunities for children to compete with others within school and between schools; having strong links with outside sport coaches and offering opportunities for children to take part in leadership within sport.

Objective: To increase opportunities for identification and support of Gifted and Talented children in PE

Objective achieved. The able and gifted children in Year 4 had 6 sessions where they went to St Marys Middle School with other able and gifted children from local schools. They took part in a range of activities to extend their skills. Year 1 and 2 took part in a multi-skills festival within the school and then the top 2 from each class progressed on to a competition at St Marys Puddletown against the top 2 children from other schools. Year 4 able and gifted also took part in a swimming gala, an athletics competition and a tennis competition. Year 3's took part in the able and gifted tennis competition too.
