Trauma Informed Schools Parent Information Evening

As some of you may be aware, Miss Thorp has attended a 10 day course on Trauma Informed Schools. This focuses on how schools can support children that have suffered trauma as well as children that are finding school difficult.

We are offering two parent information evenings on this subject. These sessions will be useful for all parents. They will give you more insight into how to support your child's emotions, how to deescalate emotional outbursts and also give you more information on the effect of trauma on children. Trauma includes abuse, parents separating or divorcing, domestic violence and bereavement.

We will also look at the importance of attachment and secure attachments in children and what happens when children become anxiously attached or adversely attached.

Please do come along and find out more. There will be some science as well as some practical tips to support you at home. You will also find out how the school can support your child too.

Wednesday 23rd October (6-7.30pm): focusing on the brain (including positive and negative chemicals in the brain), trauma in children (including ACES) and attachments in children. **Tuesday 26th November (6-7.30pm):** focusing on anxiety in children and anger in children. It will also look at bereavement.

Please attend the 1st session if you are going to attend the 2^{nd} session as there will be a lot of information from the 1st session required for the 2^{nd} session.

PTFA News

It's the 'Bake Off' this Thursday!

The Great Frome Valley Bake Off is just days away and Ms Thorp has her 'Star Baker 2019' trophy at the ready! Thank you to everyone who's already handed in their 50p entry fee. Please bring in your 'harvest-themed' biscuits and cookies to display on tables in the main hall on Thursday morning. The office has just emailed out a sheet to fill in and put next to your child's bake. Copies are also available on the carousel.



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Remember to put your child's name on the back (so judging is anonymous).

Every child who bakes will be entered into a prize draw to win a family pass to Farmer Palmer's farm park. Staff will choose the top three 'most creative bakers' and, during school time, each child will be able to cast a vote for the 'children's choice baker' - where there will be prizes and certificates for first, second and third places. Of course, there can be only one Star Baker which will be personally chosen by Ms Thorp (aka Prue Leith)!

Prize winners will be announced straight after Harvest Festival at approximately 2.30-2.45pm in the hall - where parents are very welcome to come along. The PTFA will be serving tea and coffee (50p) until around 3.45pm and all biscuits will be available to buy (3 for £1).

Parent Drop In

The first of this year's drop in sessions is on **Tuesday 8th October**. Parents will be able to speak to the class teacher and look at their child's work. Teachers can discuss your child's next step in their learning and how you can support your child at home. You can drop in at any time during this session and the class teachers look forward to seeing you there.

There is an early morning session from **8.15 – 8.40am** and an afternoon session from **2.15 – 3pm**.

There are often many parents that would like to speak to the teacher so we ask that parents write their name on the whiteboard in the classroom as they arrive. Teachers will then speak to parents in order of their arrival!

Please remember that if you wish to speak to your child's teacher for longer than a few minutes then we are happy to arrange a separate time.
