

# Frome Valley CE First School Pupil Premium Report



### What is Pupil Premium Funding?

Pupil Premium (PP) is funding allocated by central government to all schools in England. The amount of funding available for each school is calculated according to the number of 'Looked After' and Free School Meal eligible students.

### What is the Purpose of Pupil Premium Funding?

The Government believes that the pupil premium, which in addition to main school funding, is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their wealthier peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. National research shows that children who have been eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) at any point in their school career have consistently lower educational attainment than those who have never been eligible. This money can be used for support and resources to directly support these children or indirectly through releasing time for staff to provide small group support.
